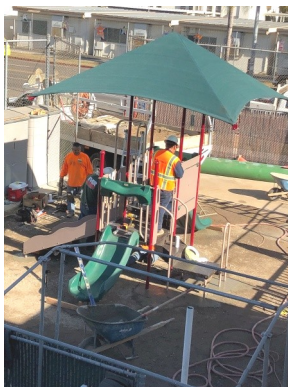
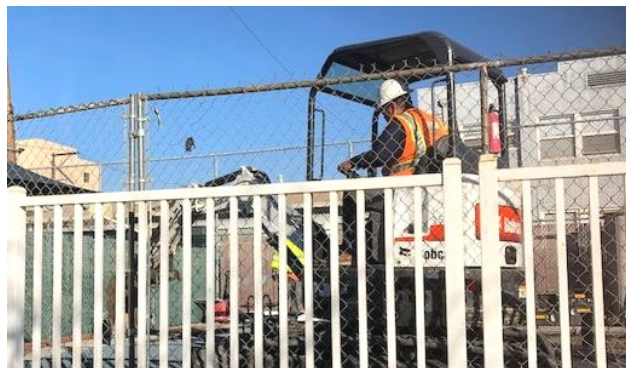
Kohn Center Playground Grand Opening


Starting the New Year with Purpose

Hands on workshop gives parents healthy options



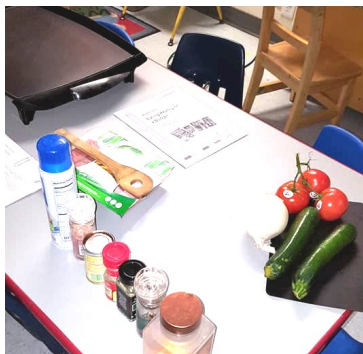
