Some of the activities will include creating a solar system, pretending to be an astronaut, water coloring their favorite planet, and creating a space helmet out of paper bags and crayons.



Communicating with Your Child

Good communication between you and your child is important for developing a positive relationship. As your child gets older, good communication will make it easier for you to talk to him about things like alcohol and drugs. Good communication with your child can start early. Two skills that are helpful for good communication with toddlers and preschoolers are praise and active listening.

Keys to Communicating with Your Child

- 1. Praise your child when she does something right. The more you praise a behavior, the more likely it is your child will behave the same way again.
- 2. Pay attention to your child when he is talking to you or trying to communicate with you. Giving him your full attention will help you understand what he is telling you. It will also make him feel like you care about what he has to say.
- 3. Set aside time each day to talk and play with your child. Creating a special time lets your child know she is important. It also strengthens the bond between the two of you.
