Our 50th Anniversary Year has Arrived

Young Horizons is turning 50—celebrations are planned throughout the year.

Since 1969, Young Horizons has been serving the youngest, most vulnerable population in our community and we look forward to 50 more years and beyond. In the late '60s, early education was in its infancy. Researchers were learning about the importance of preparing a child early and providing opportunities for social and emotional growth through shared experiences.

Our founders, Dr. Gerhard and Irena Kohn were ahead of their time and understood the importance not only of providing early education, but the difference it made to low-income families who didn't necessarily have the resources other children had. Dr. Kohn was a committed advocate for funding to serve this vulnerable population. Irena researched and sought resources to improve the program quality and ensure all children in our centers received the best care possible.

What a legacy they have both left. It is our commitment to continue their work and continue to serve this vulnerable population.

We know the difference it makes when a child has the early learning experiences offered in a group setting. We know that we are helping to end the cycle of poverty because parents can work, go to school, or look for a job while we care for their children. We provide parents with workshops, resources and training opportunities to enhance their skills as their child's first teacher.



Join us this year as we celebrate fifty years of service to our community. Several events have been planned throughout the year. In April, we will have our Wine & Cheese Fest, in September our centers will open their doors for a 50th Anniversary celebration

Open House and our gala, as detailed below, will take place October 17th.

Irena will be greatly missed, but her legacy will live on for years to come. Her leadership and inspiration will be remembered forever.
