Close to 650 guests listened as Board Chair, Roger Scott, and Executive Director, Sarah Soriano, gave acceptance speeches expressing gratitude to the Chamber for this honor and to the community of Long Beach for their support over these past 50 years.

The Chamber gave a total of four awards. Co-honorees in the “Destination Tomorrow” category were Farmers & Merchants Bank and CenterCal Properties, LLC (retail complex developers of 2nd & PCH). “Nonprofit” co-honorees were Young Horizons and the Boys & Girls Club of Long Beach. Everyone was grateful for this prestigious honor.

135 Graduates move on to Kindergarten

Each year, as we enroll children in the summer and fall, we watch timid, sometimes crying children clinging to their mother or father at drop off. Slowly, they begin to make friends, become accustomed to their environment and relax a little more. Soon, we see laughing, happy children learning, playing, and engaged in activities. It is a beautiful cycle to observe and realize that we have the great privilege and responsibility in helping to shape these young children's lives.

Then June rolls around and we realize, it's time to let them go. It is bittersweet. Parents, teachers and children have formed

relationships and caring bonds. But we know, they are ready to move on. They are ready for Kindergarten and new adventures. Teachers have poured into them all their early learning knowledge and, like little sponges, they have absorbed it all.

At their Graduation, children have the opportunity to show off that learning. They sing, dance, recite poems and proudly display their preschool certificate as they receive it. Parents are so proud to see their children's development and express much gratitude for our program. We celebrate their first educational milestone together.



Take Home Book Program Celebration

Love of reading instilled early

Reading is key to success. At Young Horizons, we value the importance of teaching children the love of reading early in life. We are fortunate to partner with the Bring Me A Book Foundation to offer the Take Home Book Program to our families.

Each year, we offer this program free of charge through this partnership. Children receive a book bag with 3-5 books which they read for one week at home with family members. Prompt cards are included for parents to extend the learning and ensure reading comprehension. At the end of this 30-week program, families and children alike are celebrated for completing the program. Siblings and other family members who have read with the child all receive a certificate of participation. We know that it takes the entire family for this program to succeed. Parents have expressed how grateful they are for this program and how much their children learn and love reading. A special thank you to them and to our centers staff for helping make this program a success.



Field Trips

Extending Learning through hands-on experience

To extend the learning of our monthly theme, Wonders of the Sea, we took our children to the Aquarium of the Pacific to see first-hand the sea creatures they learned about during the month. Children loved exploring the beautiful exhibits and the shark tank tunnel was everyone's favorite. The touch tank gave children the opportunity to feel an actual shark. Children learned how to use a 2-finger touch to be safe. We were happy to have parent volunteers assist and are very grateful to our staff as well.
