50 years ago, Young Horizons' founders, Dr. Gerhard and Irena Kohn had a dream to serve the children of low-income families with a safe, secure, "home-away-from-home" where they could learn and play. They began with a school serving children of all abilities. In early 1984, they were approached by the director of the California Department of Education, Child Development Division, and asked to take over a state contract serving children in Long Beach. Irena tells the story of how, in the matter of months, they hired the staff, purchased all the materials, set up the classrooms and opened on July 1 serving this high-need population. Since then, Young Horizons has grown to fi p locations serving over 400 children daily.

MESSAGE FROM OUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Five decades have passed since we began serving children and families. Those decades have brought much joy as well as much hardship. We have learned lessons as we went and have grown because of them. As we look to the future, one thing is certain, we will continue to serve the children and families that need our services. The need for affordable child care is still high in Long Beach. Our free or low cost programs give families the ability to place their children in a safe environment while parents work, go to school or lookfor a job. Our food program provides over 140,000 meals annually to our children to ensure they are growing

healthy and strong. We engage our parents with monthly training opportunities, resources and workshops to help them succeed in their role as parents.

We are grateful for supporters throughout the years who have believed in and supported our mission to continue this work. We welcome volunteers to serve on our board, to read to children, or to support in whatever way you can to serve our children and families. We have done this for 50 years and will continue for years to come.



OUR 50 YEAR HISTORICAL TIMELINE

This timeline highlights major events that helped shape Young Horizons into the leader in care and early education that it is today.

- Agency was first incorporated as the Foundation for Educational and 1969 Behavioral Therapy. Dr. Gerhard Kohn and his wife, Irena, founded the program as a child day care, tutoring and a reading program for children struggling in school. Dr. Kohn provided family counseling and individual therapy to struggling teens.
- Name of organization changed to Young Horizons. The original name 1972 was long and not easily understood. The board of directors wanted to have a name that connoted early childhood and the possibility for the future on their young horizon. The new name was adopted.
- Young Horizons was requested to take over a California Department of 1984 Education contract for Child Development services at two locations in Long Beach.
- Expanded with two additional locations for a total of four centers 1993 serving 156 children.
- Moved to new building at 501 Atlantic Avenue combining two centers 1994 into this location along with administration offices and kitchen.
- Applied for and received new State contract for California State 1997 Preschool Program. We opened a new center to serve children in North Long Beach. This center moved to central Long Beach in 2001 due to building constraints and to meet the high need in the 90806 zip code.
- Opened new center in North Long Beach serving infants, toddlers and 2004 preschoolers.
- Latest center opened Ludloff Center named after our long-standing 2007 board member and current advisory board member, Ed Ludloff. This allowed us to expand our State Preschool program to 82 additional children.
- Present day Young Horizons serves over 400 children daily ages 6 2008months to 5 years old, over 600 yearly. We employ 90 staff members that including teaching staff, cooks, a driver and administrative staff. Our food program provides over 140,000 meals per year.

YOUNG HORIZONS: A SUMMARY OF PURPOSE

Young Horizons' primary purpose is ensuring that low-income children develop the fundamental knowledge and skills they need to keep up and compete with their more affluent peers in kindergarten and beyond.

However, decades of experience have taught us that providing care and education is not enough. We must also ensure that children receive appropriate nutrition because hungry children cannot develop and learn. Children need access to books in the home so that reading becomes a pleasure and a habit, rather than a struggle. Parents need to understand the stages of child development and parenting techniques so that they can provide stable and nurturing home environments that do not hinder their children's ability to learn and form trusting relationships. Teachers must know how to create supportive relationships with parents so that parents can turn to them for advice or referrals to community resources.

Young Horizons intentionally addresses these diverse needs of low-income children and their families to give these vulnerable children the greatest chance of succeeding in school and in life.


makes Young Horizons the best Environment for any child out there.


Thank you Young Horizons for understanding the needs of parents like me, you have the best staff ever, very positive teachers, very engaging with the parents and I really appreciate you.

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
