#### SHARED SCIENCE RETURNS TO YOUNG HORIZONS

We were grateful to have the Shared Science team visit our centers once again this winter. This year's lesson was on simple machines such as pulleys and levers. Children explored questions such as: How do simple machines help us do work? Simple machines can create leverage to lift loads using pulleys. The activity tied in to our monthly theme of Transportation by incorporating how simple machines help us do work every day of our lives. These activities help children learn about items in our everyday lives and who knows? We may be inspiring the next generation of engineers and architects.





#### **ORAL HEALTH PRESENTATION**

The Long Beach Health Department Oral Health Program visited all five Young Horizons centers. Maria James and Leo the Lion puppet conducted an interactive 20-minute classroom presentation on healthy and non-healthy foods. Leo the Lion modeled proper teeth brushing procedures using a giant mouth prop. He modeled how to floss, brush the teeth and tongue, and shared the Two and Two rule (2 minutes, twice a day). Every child received a dental kit to take home.



#### TRI-ANNUAL REVIEW DEMONSTRATES COMPLIANCE

Every three years, the Department of Education conducts an intensive review of contracted programs to ensure compliance with all regulatory requirements of the California State Preschool Program (CSPP). This review examines twenty-one areas of compliance, including enrollment practices, family engagement opportunities, program quality, administration, and fiscal operations. We are very pleased to



report that we met compliance in all areas. We strive to provide a high-quality program for our children and families, and it is reassuring to have this review show we do just that.

## SUPPORTING COMMUNITY THROUGH INTERNSHIP PROGRAM PARTICIPATION

Internships provide students with hands-on experience in their field of study. Young Horizons has partnered with the Long Beach Unified School District and Cal State University Long Beach (CSULB) to provide internship opportunities to students interested in the early care and education field.

We welcomed Athziry Moreno from Poly High School this winter to our Ludloff Center. She gained hands-on experience in the classroom and had the opportunity to create a lesson plan that included an activity, the learning objectives, new vocabulary, and a review. She was able to implement it in the classroom with the support of the teacher. Athziry hopes to pursue her career in the education field.

Jailene Meraz, CSULB, worked at our North Pacific Center and at the administration office. She shadowed each member of the administrative team to learn more about the roles and functions of each position to gain an understanding of the way a nonprofit works. She even had the opportunity to observe a parent/teacher conference (with parent's permission) to see how all parts of the system are vital to the success of the organization. Lastly, she assisted at our fundraising Gala to learn about fundraising events.

We will continue to work with local programs to provide internship opportunities to help our students succeed and help our community as well.
