LONG BEACH EARLY LEARNING HUB

Young Horizons is excited to participate in the first phase of the LB Early Learning HUB (The HUB). This project is a collaboration of the Mayor's Fund for Education, the Long Beach Unified School District and the Long Beach Early Childhood Education Committee. The HUB will work to support all families, whatever their needs or budget, in finding quality and affordable childcare.

The Long Beach Early Learning Hub will work with childcare providers in the greater Long Beach community to match families with available childcare spaces that fit their needs. They will help fill vacancies through community-wide marketing and outreach, a streamlined search feature, a universal application, and a centralized enrollment system.

Families will be able to select Young Horizons when applying for care and submit all paperwork online to facilitate the enrollment process.



PLANNING OUR 2023-2024 YEAR

Every year, our administrative team sets aside a day in the summer to plan for the coming year. Activities are planned to meet all learning standards and goals, translating the overarching concepts into daily lesson plans. Young Horizons uses a Thematic Curriculum with monthly themes that explore the world around us. We incorporate Math/Science skills, Language/Literacy Skills, Visual & Performing Arts (Dramatic Play, Music and Dance) and Health, Nutrition and Physical Development, into our weekly lesson planning. Each activity is tied to a



developmental milestone and the California Learning Foundations (CLF). The CLFs outline the knowledge and skills most children can achieve when they experience the interactions, instruction and environments that promote early learning and development.

We know the learning that will take place this year will allow children to grow, develop and thrive.
