### COMMUNITY HELPERS SHOW UP FOR CHILDREN'S LEARNING

Our learning theme for the month of September was Community Helpers. Children learned about all the different jobs and services that make up our community. We reached out to our community and had a great response.

Long Beach Fire Stations 11, 7 & 1 visited all five of our locations and shared information about fire safety and demonstrated the stop, drop and roll. Children had the opportunity to climb inside fire trucks and explore the hoses, tools, and ladders.











The Long Beach Police Department North and West Division officers came out and shared with children about their important role in the community, gave police capes to children, and children were also able to go inside patrol unit.



Tony Chacon, Community Relations Coordinator, from Long Beach Transit shared a very interactive presentation on how important buses are in our community to help people get to their destinations.

Long Beach Public Library Early Literacy/Reading Program Specialist, Sheridan Cazarez coordinated visits from librarians of different branches to discuss their role, read a story, and conduct a learning activity with children.

Even our very own contactor, Mark Dulaney of MCD Construction shared his role as a contractor for Young Horizons. He described the uses of his tools and safety equipment and allowed the children to explore them.

# THE GREAT SHAKEOUT 10/19 AT 10:19AM

Young Horizons participated in the Great ShakeOut Earthquake Drill at all of our centers. The Great ShakeOut drills are an annual event for families, schools, and organizations to practice what should be done during an earthquake and to be prepared. All participants throughout the state of California, on the same day and the same time stop, drop, and roll. This brings more awareness to being prepared for an earthquake and, the State checks their emergency alert system by sending out alert text messages. In addition to our monthly drills, we act out different scenarios. Some children participate indoors and others outdoors. We also take this time to check emergency supplies and food to make sure nothing has expired. All staff and any visitors were encouraged to participate. At the Kohn Center, there was an injury simulation where children and staff provided aid to an "injured" staff member.

Children were able to discuss how they felt, and teachers shared the importance of being prepared and knowing what to do in the event of an earthquake.
