

98% of children reached their developmental milestones



# How one teacher engaged families during the pandemic

I have been a teacher at Young Horizons since 2013. I love my job working with children and engaging their little minds. During the pandemic, learning how to adapt came without warning and fast, especially in the education field. I work with preschool age children, and both children and their families had to learn and adjust to these changes as they came, just like me.

Due to everything shutting down, I quickly tried finding ways to keep my children learning and engaged remotely. All while still giving them a safe, loving, and emotional assurance that this "scary" virus would pass, and we would one day go back to our classrooms together. I first reached out to parents through phone calls, emails, and even text messages, to assure them I was here to support. I guided them on how to use Zoom, stayed connected via emails regarding any Health Department updates as well as center updates.


Zoom was a learning process. I feel as if my students and I learned ways to keep Zoom calls interesting together and we found so many good at home activities to do. I met virtually with large groups, small groups, and individually. Some parents worked late hours, so I made sure to always make myself available to their schedules as much as I possibly could. Children loved seeing their peers on screen, others were shy at first, but that soon changed. I used a closed Instagram classroom group to post about future meeting times, activities, and materials needed. This allowed parents to plan ahead and make themselves available. I also shared photos of homework, activity ideas, and resources. Children enjoyed the Zoom Yoga, the Virtual Farm Field Trip, the zoo animal project, and the "All about me" project, to name a few.

The parents were an amazing and supportive group. I could not have done it without them. Building such great teamwork created a strong relationship among all my parents. This relationship continued throughout the entire pandemic, and to this day. It has been a learning experience and a guide to continue growing in the classroom and with families.
